This is a summary of the annual report for INDEPENDENT COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES BENEFITS ASSOCIATION, INC. MEDICAL PLAN, EIN 42-1576411, Plan Number 501, for the period April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019. The annual report has been filed with the Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

INDEPENDENT COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES BENEFITS ASSOCIATION, INC has committed itself to pay the following types of claims incurred under the terms of the plan:

Insurance Information

The plan has (a) contract(s) with Blue Cross Blue Shield of Florida, OptumRx, Inc., and Aetna, Inc. to pay the following types of claims incurred under the terms of the plan:

The total premiums paid for the plan year ending March 31, 2019 were \$90,551,925.

Because (it is a) (they are) so called "experience-rated" contract(s), the premium costs are affected by, among other things, the number and size of claims. Of the total insurance premiums paid for the plan year ending March 31, 2019, the premiums paid under such experience-rated contract(s) were \$90,551,925 and the total of all benefit claims paid under the(se) experiences-rated contract(s) during the plan year was \$90,551,925.

Basic Financial Statement

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$15,434,923 as of March 31, 2019, compared to \$19,933,588 as of April 1, 2018. During the plan year the plan experienced a change in its net assets of \$-4,498,665. This change includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The plan had total income of \$94,801,210 which included employer contributions of \$52,598,362, employee contributions of \$41,327,284, other contributions of \$0, gain/loss of \$0 from the sale of assets, and earnings from investments of \$875,564.

Total plan expenses were \$97,695,158. These expenses included \$4,952,128 in administrative expenses and \$92,743,030 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries, and \$0 in other expenses.
